.. (To quote the song) The U.S. Supreme Court struck down a federal law in June that banned the carrying of weapons by federal workers, ruling that the prohibition was unconstitutional. The decision could have far-reaching implications for the rights of government employees. But will it apply to private businesses? The U.S. Supreme Court announced Monday that the federal ban on carrying firearms on federal property — the so-called "gun-free zones" — is unconstitutional. Saying the 2nd Amendment protects the right of people to bear arms for self-defense, the Supreme Court said the federal government does not have the power to prohibit carrying firearms in areas where they are historically and traditionally allowed — such as federal courthouses. The 6-3 decision, by the court's conservative majority, marks a victory for gun rights activists and their allies in Congress. "We hold that the concealed carry of firearms by appropriately licensed law-abiding citizens is not prohibited by the 2nd Amendment or by any other provision of the Constitution," Justice Antonin Scalia wrote in the majority opinion. A written

opinion from Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, a liberal, said the government's power to regulate firearms is subject to constitutional constraints and that "the individual right to keep and bear arms must be recognized as an attribute of personal sovereignty." The vote, in which liberal Justice Stephen Breyer joined the majority, was the third time in recent years that the court has considered the right to bear arms. In a separate majority opinion, Scalia joined with Ginsburg to say that the 2nd Amendment does not protect the right to carry weapons in public. The outcome of Monday's decision "shows that there is no greater passion than liberty," said the National Rifle Association's executive vice president, Wayne LaPierre. "Our great heritage of freedom is at stake." The court's action overturning the federal law was widely expected and is likely to add another notch in the debate over gun control, which has intensified in recent years. President Barack Obama and his fellow Democrats say tighter gun laws are necessary to curb mass shootings, but have little chance of winning congressional passage. The measure passed by Congress and signed into law by Obama in January 2010 stated that "the Secretary of Defense may prescribe regulations to prohibit the possession of a firearm, except a pistol or revolver, by any member of the uniformed services on federal property."
